

Who is responsible for procuring permits, sending the associated notifications, etc for any sensitive/aquatic areas that might need to be treated? Or are there no applicable sites to be treated?
There are no applicable sites; however, it is the responsibility of the contractor to be compliant with the rules for applying pesticides in the State of Ohio.

How soon will we be notified of the tasks to be completed and then how quickly will our turn-around times need to be from reception of task order to execution of task?

When a work request is issued, the contractor must respond within 10 days of that request. Turn-around times will then be discussed between the LMP project manager and the Contractor.

What are the primary target species?

The primary target species are found on page 3 of the RFP.

What is your overall priority list? Is it by species? By location?

Our priorities are primarily species-driven for each location.

What are the primary target areas? Will we be likely treating several small areas throughout several parks or will it be larger areas within fewer parks?

Primary target areas include those with exceptional habitat value where an infestation of an invasive species would hinder the quality of the habitat. Marshes, recently restored areas, and open meadow habitats are some areas we prioritize. Areas could be a mixture of both small and large sites.

Can we set a minimum or will there be a minimum amount of time/cost for each task order?

If your firm requires a minimum, that should be identified in your proposal. There will not be a minimum for each task order, but we will make an effort to group similar projects together.
