

Nancy Prince, an award winning quilt artist from Orlando, Florida, specializes in thread painting. Her anyone-can-doit approach to thread painting is fun, easy and a new way for quilters to broaden their quilting experience. She has recently introduced thread sketching into her workshop offerings.

Nancy is the author of *Simple Thread Painting* and *Thread Painting with Style* both published by the American Quilter's Society. She has appeared on *Simply Quilts*, *Creative Living* 

and *The Quilt Show with Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims*, has appeared in national magazines and won numerous quilting awards. She has won first place in Large Pictorial at the AQS Quilt Show in Paducah, Outstanding Innovative Quilt at Road to California, an Honorable Mention at the International Quilt Festival in Houston, plus Best of Show at the NQA Quilt Show. Her quilts have won Best of Show, Viewer's Choice, Artistic Merit, Best Machine Workmanship and Judge's Recognition at recent shows and first place at Bernina University.

Nancy is totally addicted to thread painting and her enthusiasm in workshops can be contagious! Students comment on her commitment to one-on-one attention and her upbeat attitude. She travels the country teaching and lecturing to anyone who will listen in order to share the excitement and creativity thread painting brings to the quilting world. She excels in taking the mystery out of thread painting—making it easy for anyone to master.

Nancy and her husband Tom have three grown sons, three talented daughters-inlaw and eight adorable grandchildren. She spends most of her time juggling her family, quilting and teaching her passion—this passion has enriched her life and keeps her centered and focused.

The patchwork is made from 2 ½-inch or 5-inch squares. The bag bottom measures approximately 10 inches square and the sides are about 17 inches tall. You will have plenty of time to finish this bag in class. Pattern and interfacing fee of \$17 payable to instructor in class. Extra interfacing panels will be available for purchase.

#### UMBRELLA CLASS: RAIN... Rain...Go Away!

You Won't Be Saying That After You Make Your Own Umbrella!

All levels, one-day workshop, sewing machine, Fee: \$30 (plus \$20 kit fee payable to instructor in class)

Don't let a rainy day get you down! Make a unique/designer 48" umbrella with your choice of fabrics to brighten any rainy day. Cotton is the easiest fabric to work with, especially when making your first umbrella (you'll want to make more!), but any fabric will work because it can




be waterproofed (spray optional and available to purchase in class for \$9). Pattern/ umbrella frame fee of \$20 payable to instructor in class includes a gorgeous woodhandled 48-inch classic frame. Extra frames will be available for purchase, along with children and doll size frames and patterns. You will NEVER look at fabric the same way again! You'll ask yourself, "how will this look as an umbrella?"

Finished size is  $58 \times 70$  inches plus optional extended sizes ( $70 \times 82$  and  $82 \times 94$ ). Fabric requirements include one package of  $40 \ 2 \frac{1}{2}$  inch strips and six yards of background fabric. Pattern fee of \$19 payable to the instructor. Additional notions for purchase in class include the 12-inch add-a-quarter ruler (\$10) and water soluble fabric glue stick (\$3).

stripes, dots, velvets, satins, other textures and fur prints in a variety of colors and values. When done, these can be quilted and bound, quilted and framed, or just framed.

#### VASE OF BEAUTIES

All levels, two-day workshop, hand wool/cotton stitch work, Fee: \$62

Create a vase full of beautiful flowers using felted wool and embroidery with perle cotton. You can pick from vase shapes and flower designs to create an individualized still life with the techniques taught in class or follow the pattern as seen in the photo. The Vase of Beauties block is 15x21 inches. It includes hand applique techniques using a lightweight fusible (Mistyfuse©) to adhere the wool pieces to the background. It is very easy to use and stitch through. We will use an easy cotton applique technique for the cotton pieces. A variety of embroidery stitches will be taught and will greatly enhance the flowers with detail and texture. Pattern

Join certified instructor Karen Conley for this journey into paper piecing using Judy Niemeyer's techniques—including her floating points. The pattern includes all foundation papers, Stitch-N-Peel stabilizers for the center circles and a full-size quilting design option. The pattern will make four 18" placemats. Approximate yardage, including bindings, is 4½ yards. Pattern is available from the



instructor for \$33. Additional notions for purchase in class include 12-inch add-aquarter (\$10), water soluble fabric glue stick (\$3) and water soluble fabric glue pen (\$8).

#### STUDYING THE STARS

Intermediate, two-day workshop, sewing machine, Fee: \$90

Join Mary Huey for a two-day exploration of machine-piecing hexagonal blocks. We will start with the basic six-pointed star and expand from there while building your y-seam skills using Mary's chain-piecing technique. Feel free to choose a commercial pattern such as Lucy Carson Kingwell's Smitten or create a



layout of your own. You will learn to mix and blend a wide variety of fabrics from your stash including how to manage stripes and directional fabrics, uncover fussy cutting gems and create subtle secondary designs. Rotary cutting skills using templates and accurate piecing skills are prerequisites. #### FABRIC PAINTING TULIPS All levels, sewing machine second day, two-day workshop, Fee: \$59

Fabric painting is not as messy or time consuming as dyeing. You can get wonderful effects of paint, water and salt just overnight. We will paint the fabric the first day, then cut applique pieces and appliquilt them the next. Many of you will be done with the whole quilt in class. We will stretch fabric on the frames (frames are available for purchase for \$15), paint them, and apply salt. Frames and salt are provided, students buy



their own paint. These frames stay overnight to dry and will be delivered to the quilt class room. Students then iron the fabric, cut pattern pieces from them, arrange the flowers and appliquilt raw edge pieces to a batting sandwich. Project size is about 16 x 21 inches. Pattern fee of \$5 payable to instructor in class.

#### **GUIDELINES & RULES**

One entry per person. One name listed as exhibitor (or contact person for group quilt and group names and school quilts). Exhibitor or contact person receives pass for unlimited visits during Quilts 2017 dates. School quilt participants will be permitted a one-time registered group visit at no charge to see quilts only or each student may attend show one time on own with class names submitted in advance.

- Entry fee is \$12 and non-refundable. Entry form and fee must be postmarked by Tuesday, January 10, 2017.
- All quilts must have a four-inch sleeve stitched in back for hanging. Irregularly shaped quilts and miniatures must have appropriate means for hanging. Pinned sleeves are not acceptable.
- Entries must be clean and free of dirt and pet hair. We reserve the right to reject pieces that are soiled. Because Farmpark is a family facility, judges may reject a quilt due to the suitability of its theme.
- Judging categories are based on the size and type of the quilt, techniques used (applique, pieced, mixed) and style. Categories are listed on the entry form. Judges reserve the right to reassign, combine, add or eliminate categories depending on the number of entries received. All judged elements must be visible for judging.
- Quilts with false backs will be disqualified from ribbon winning.
- Heirloom, group, youth and school quilts are accepted for display only. School quilts receive a participation ribbon. Heirloom quilts must be a minimum of 50 years old.
- All entries must be quilted except fabric dolls and those specialty items in "special interest" category.
- Doll bodies must be made completely of fabric, including the faces. No dolls with porcelain or ceramic faces are accepted. Dolls may have quilting on the clothing. Minimum height: six inches.
- Entries submitted in previous Lake Metroparks quilt shows are not eligible.
- Quilt item must have been completed within the past two years to be eligible for entry in a judged category.
- Exhibitor may choose whether or not to sell his/her quilt during Quilts 2017. Lake Metroparks receives 20% commission on all sales during the show—commission taken from sale price listed.
- Entry fees are non-refundable.

#### PRIZES

- Prize baskets and ribbons are awarded to Best of Show and People's Choice winners (determined by popular vote of visitors attending the show).
- People's Choice winners announced March 21.
- First, second and third place ribbons are awarded in all categories.
- \$25 gift certificates are awarded to first place winners.
- Gifts and ribbons are awarded to "special commendation" winners for Best Machine Quilting and Best Hand Quilting.

#### **DEFINITIONS OF TERMS**

**EXHIBITOR:** Person entering an item in the show. Exhibitor may be designer, owner, quilter, relative or caretaker.

**JUDGED INDIVIDUAL ENTRY:** Entire quilt project completed by exhibitor. Quilt top construction and quilting is done by the same person.

**JUDGED GENERAL ENTRY:** Quilt top construction made by exhibitor; however, finishing technique of quilting through the layers was outsourced.

**DISPLAY QUILT:** School participation quilt, heirloom quilt, group or round robin quilt, guild quilt, framed quilt, t-shirt quilt, guilt submitted by exhibitor other than maker of quilt or quilt received after required entry date are not eligible for judging.

BED QUILT: Made for use as a bed covering, size crib to king, including lap quilts.

WALL HANGING: Made to hang on a wall for display.

**PICTORIAL:** A quilted wall hanging of a recreated portrait image of a person, place or thing. Preprinted fabric panels or multiple block images within the quilt do not belong in this category.

**ART QUILT:** Free-form original abstract work or stylized image theme composition may include multi-dimensional mixed mediums and/or embellishments. No commercial patterns are used in this category. Size is less than 65 inches on any side, quilted through three layers.

**SPECIAL INTEREST QUILT:** Includes crazy quilt, tied, yo-yo, whole cloth quilt, cathedral window, stenciled, etc.

**KITS:** Quilt projects with pre-selected fabric and/or pre-cut pieces or blocks are considered display only.

ROUND ROBIN quilts are considered display only.

**RECYCLED, RESCUED OR ORPHAN BLOCKS** made from a known or unknown source and set/ finished into a quilt by exhibitor should be placed in "Display Quilt" category and not judged.

DOLL: A character figure made completely of fabric, may include quilted clothing.

**QUILT:** A covering or wall hanging with three layers (two layers of fabric and one layer of batting) and quilted through.

TITLE OF ENTRY: Original name you give your entry! Can be pattern name if desired.

**HEIRLOOM:** A valued family possession handed down from generation to generation. Must be at least 50 years old.


GROUP QUILT: A group of people contributing to the construction of the quilt top and/or quilting.

PIECED QUILT: Piecing predominates over other techniques in amount or effect.

APPLIQUE QUILT: Applique predominates over other techniques in amount or effect.

**MIXED TECHNIQUE:** Two or more major construction techniques used to develop design of the top, not including basic sashing, quilting or trapunto. Techniques include but are not limited to piecing, applique, embroidery, photos, stencils, etc. Equal amounts of two techniques will qualify this entry, otherwise choose category for predominant technique.

**MINIATURE:** Quilt made of blocks smaller than five inches in size and made in small scale to original-size quilt. Any side smaller than 26 inches.
