The Children’s Schoolhouse Nature Park features two classrooms, interactive exhibits, a hands-on Discovery Room, a Bug Zoo and a wildlife observation room. A half-mile trail winds through meadow, forest, stream and pond habitats and includes two outdoor teaching areas. The facility and most of the trails are accessible.

Penitentiary Glen Nature Center features classrooms, an auditorium, hands-on exhibits, a wildlife viewing area and a picnic shelter. Three-and-a-half miles of designated trails lead to field, forest, pond and marsh habitats and to the edge of the famous gorge.

The Wildlife Center is dedicated to helping injured and orphaned native Ohio wildlife through wildlife rehabilitation and environmental education. Recovering wildlife are housed in enclosures and flight cages in the animal yard prior to release. Local hawks, owls and other permanent residents are also visible in the animal yard. An accessible trail loops through the yard.

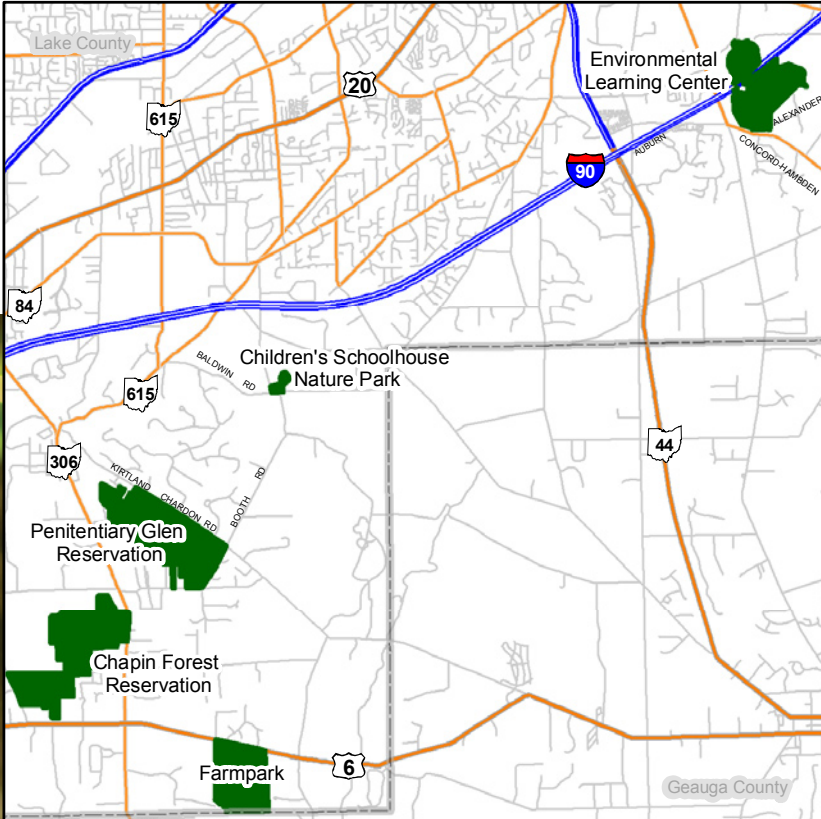
