The Lake Metroparks Wildlife Center is currently looking for dedicated, enthusiastic individuals to volunteer at our rehabilitation/environmental education facility. The center receives 2,000 animals per year for rehabilitation and presents more than 380 programs throughout Northeastern Ohio annually. We only accomplish our mission with help from dedicated volunteers. Volunteer duties include diet preparation, cage cleaning, orphan care, animal care/training, assisting with programs, participating in fundraisers, and other projects as needed.

We are also looking for eager individuals to specialize in our wildlife rescue program designed by the staff of the Wildlife Center. These volunteers are needed to rescue injured and/or orphaned wild animals and transport them to the Wildlife Center for treatment.

Furthermore, we are looking for a "traveling educator" to assess wildlife concerns in order to assist our local citizens with a wildlife friendly solution to their problems.

No experience is necessary. Specialized rescue training will be provided. Flexible schedules are available seven days a week. All rescuer calls are fielded through the Wildlife Center. Equipment, uniforms and supplies will be provided. Volunteers must be able to bend and stoop. A valid Ohio drivers' license is required.

The Wildlife Center is open seven days a week from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. There will be a mandatory training for all new volunteers. This orientation will acquaint volunteers with the Wildlife Center and include detailed trainings on all safety protocols, zoonotic disease, rescue tactics, orphan care and nutrition and permanent resident history and specialized care.
