

## Cappuccino ...A Party for 4

---

“**Cappuccino**” is a great opportunity to learn Judy Niemeyer’s efficient and simple paper-piecing techniques by creating a tablerunner and four placemats! If you are interested in creating a quilt instead of a tablerunner and placemats, you can use the same blocks to create Judy’s Stepping Stones quilt. (Take a look at [www.quiltworx.com/patterns](http://www.quiltworx.com/patterns) ). I’ll have both patterns available in class.

To make **Cappuccino**, you’ll need the following **items**:

36 – 2-1/2” strips . A mixture of light, medium, and dark fabrics. These can be pulled from your stash or you can purchase a package of “Tonga Treats”, “Bali Pops” or even a “Jelly Roll”! While *any* fabric can be used for Judy Niemeyer’s beautiful quilts, you’ll find that batiks are especially beautiful and easy to sew because they have no right or wrong side.

5/8 of a yard of black fabric.

Good quality thread in your favorite neutral color

Medium size cutting mat and your favorite rotary cutter (bring a 60 mm if you have one).

We’ll use the following **tools** in class. I’ll bring a classroom set of tools with me so no need to purchase them.

Add-a quarter ruler (12” or 18”)

A sheet of template plastic

A glue stick

Assorted binder clips, paper clips

Flower head pins

A “purple thang”

Zip-loc bags

Scotch tape
